2026 ELECTION INFORMATION

The 2026 Midterm Elections will be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026.

Below are important dates and other relevant information:

- Thursday, September 9th – Absentee ballot mailing begins.
- Friday, October 9th – Voter registration deadline.
- Thursday, October 15th - In-Person early voting begins.**
- Tuesday, October 20 - Deadline to request absentee ballot.
- Saturday, October 31st - In-Person early voting ends.
- Tuesday, November 3 - Election Day. Polling places are open from 6:30am to 7:30pm.**
- Tuesday, November 3rd - deadline to return absentee ballots.
- Friday, November 13th - County Canvass. Election results certified.

Republicans in the NC General Assembly voted to suppress voters' rights, and because of that voters will be asked to show photo ID when voting in North Carolina. Most voters will simply show their driver's license, but there are many other acceptable photo IDs. All voters will be allowed to vote with or without a photo ID.

Don't have Voter ID?

2 WAYS TO GET A FREE PHOTO ID CARD

Any registered Caswell voter can get a free photo ID from the county Board of Elections at:
140 Main Street, Yanceyville, NC

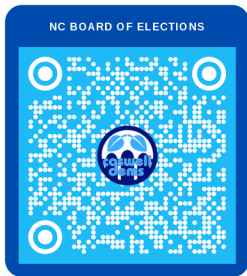
Any NC resident can get a free non-driver's ID card from the NCDMV

If a voter cannot show an acceptable photo ID when voting in person, you can still vote by filling out an *ID Exception Form* at the polls. If voting in person, the voter will vote a provisional ballot. County boards of elections must count provisional ballots with truthfully completed ID Exception Forms. If absentee-by-mail voters are unable to include a copy of your photo ID with your ballot envelope, you can also fill out an ID Exception Form to return with your ballot.

Any of the following that is unexpired, or expired for one year or less:

- North Carolina driver's license
- State ID from the NCDMV, also called "non-operator ID"
- Driver's license or non-driver ID from another state, District of Columbia, or U.S. territory (only if voter registered in North Carolina within 90 days of the election)
- U.S. Passport or U.S. Passport card
- North Carolina voter photo ID card issued by the Caswell County Board of Elections (during business hours at 140 Main Street, Yanceyville, NC)
- State or local government or charter school employee photo ID approved by the State Board of Elections
- Some college or university student photo IDs (approved by the NC State Board of Elections; see QR code below)



OR:

Any of the following, regardless of whether the ID contains an expiration or issuance date:

- Military or veterans ID card with photo issued by the U.S. government
- Tribal enrollment card with photo issued by a tribe recognized by the State of North Carolina or the federal government
- ID card with photo issued by an agency of the U.S. government or the State of North Carolina for a public assistance program**

***Although this is an acceptable form of ID under North Carolina law, the State Board is not aware of any such ID in circulation that contains a photo.*

All IDs for voting are required to have a photo.

Note: A voter 65 or older may use an expired form of acceptable ID if the ID was unexpired on their 65th birthday.
